MUSIC ALPHABET BLOCKS

New in the studio and coming soon to the-piano-studio.com online store, are Music Alphabet Blocks.

These cute blocks were the product of a morning crafting session. On impulse, I posted a picture to our piano pedagogy forum and got lots of great comments and feedback. Everyone's excited to get their hands on these!

These colourful wood blocks are the perfect size to fit on the keys of the piano. I tuck them in near the fallboard of the piano and they provide a great reminder to students that are learning their note names.

Sometimes, I stack them up on the piano with one line of the letters and their corresponding solfege symbols stacked on top. This is a helpful reminder for those students that are working on learning both systems of note naming.

Some younger students that are learning their 5 finger positions, colourcode their music to correspond with the blocks.

We also use the Music Alphabet Blocks as a composition and improvisation tool. (We pick five randomly and try to create a melody or harmonic progression around those five notes).

The possibilities are endless and I am looking forward to creating new uses and having new ideas for using these in the studio.
